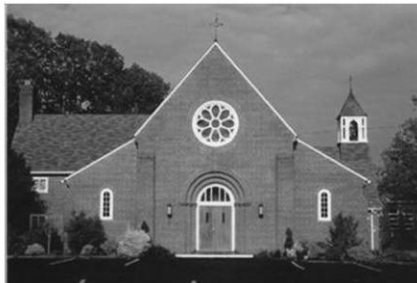

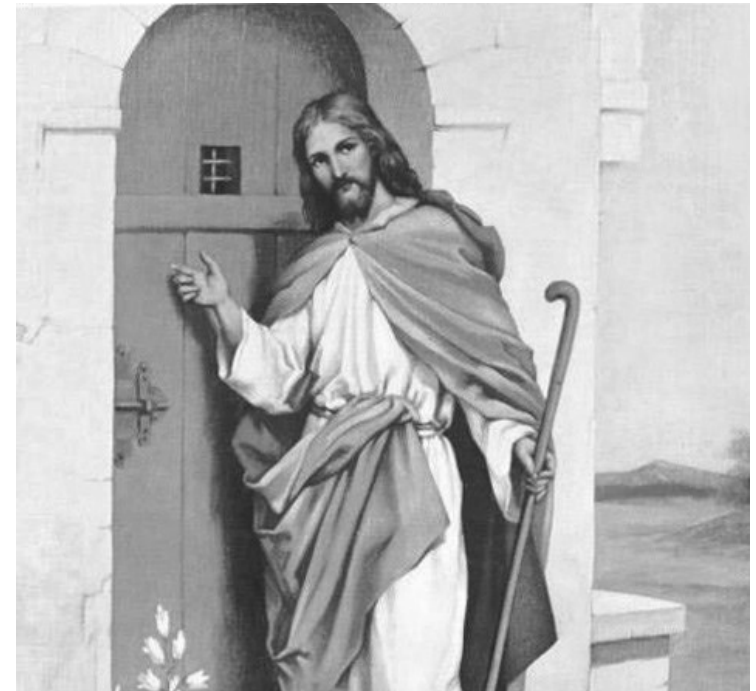

FATHER RAYMOND MOORE

Father Raymond Moore is pastor of St. Thomas More Parish in Washington, D.C., where his pastoral responsibilities include administration of St. Thomas More Catholic Academy. This Catholic elementary school is a part of the Consortium of Catholic Schools, whose mission is to provide quality Catholic education to needy families in Washington, D.C. He also serves as Dean of Southeast Washington and is a member of the Priest Council, the priest advisory board to the Archbishop.



Father Moore, a priest for thirty years, is a native of Washington, D.C. He earned his undergraduate degree in education from the University of Maryland at College Park and a Master of Arts degree in systematic theology from Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, Maryland.

Following ordination, his first parish assignment was at St. Francis Xavier in Southeast Washington. Since then he has served in a number of parishes where he distinguished himself in the areas of preaching, youth ministry and education. For a number of years he was Chaplain to Archbishop Carroll High School where he developed the campus ministry program and coordinated student retreats and helped form the gospel choir.

Father Moore has been blessed to serve as pastor of Our Lady Queen of Peace in Southeast Washington, St. Peter Claver in St. Inigoes, MD and St. Joseph's in Largo, MD.

In addition to his parish accomplishments, Father Moore is recognized for his active leadership in dealing with a wide variety of community related issues in the various communities in which he has served. These include collaborating with other pastors and community leaders in addressing issues of public housing, drug abuse, education and employment. He has served as a chaplain in local correctional centers, an advisor to the Prince George's County Adult Drug Court, and Chair of the Cheltenham Youth Facility Advisory Board and is a member of the Board of Directors for the Consortium of Catholic Academies.
